

Our Curriculum

Children's learning is at the heart of everything we do at Hiltingbury and has been built around the needs of our children. It delivers the ambitions of our school, as well as addressing national statutory requirements through the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum and the National Curriculum.

Early Years Foundation Stage

Children follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum, building on their existing successes. We are committed to ensuring every child makes a positive, happy and seamless leap into the beginning of their school journey in a safe and nurturing environment. Our experienced early years team create a stimulating play based learning environment, recognising the value of outdoor learning. Children initiate learning experiences by themselves and with their peers through a range of creative opportunities. Children are given the opportunity to actively explore and investigate their environment. They will be learning through carefully planned exploratory play opportunities alongside adult led teaching. We are proud of the opportunities we offer through our open ended, free-flow learning environment. Our curriculum is carefully planned both based on the children's interests as well as offering creative topics that will increase and widen every child's knowledge and skills. Woven through our child-centred curriculum, children learn and make strong progress across all areas of the curriculum.

Key Stage One

Leading on from our child-initiated curriculum in Year R. we aim to encourage children's interests and make learning relevant and exciting for all. The creative curriculum encourages children to work collaboratively, whilst encouraging independent learning through topics that capture children's current interests. Teachers thrive on planning creative and memorable experiences within the learning environment and beyond, and children have many first hand experiences to enrich their learning. Hiltingbury Infant School seeks to develop the talents of our children beyond the national expectations through an integrated and creative curriculum. We want our children to be confident, successful and responsible lifelong learners who enjoy and value themselves. Our curriculum is designed to encourage the development of the whole child through our 'Learner for Life Skills' and 'Growth Mindset' approach to learning.

Home Learning

Learning at home helps children to embed important skills in particular those of independent learning. Home learning is set by the class teacher and builds on learning that has taken place in the classroom. It will also include regular reading at home, which we encourage parents to complete together as frequently as possible. Home learning can also include English, maths or topic work and provides you, as parents with opportunities to have an active role in your child's education; evaluating their progress.



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Hiltingbury Heroes -Learners for Life

Learner for life skills are thoroughly embedded into our curriculum using our 'Hiltingbury Heroes' who can be found in every classroom. Their job is to facilitate the children in becoming 'Successful learners, confident individuals and responsible citizens'. Each 'Hiltingbury Hero' has a set of skills that are distinctive and coherent; they are also interlinked. Children are likely to encounter skills from several groups in any one experience. In order to acquire and develop fundamental concepts such as organising oneself, managing change, taking responsibility and perseverance, children will need to apply skills from all six 'Heroes' in a wide range of learning contexts.

At Hiltingbury, children are taught to develop a growth mindset by seeing mistakes as an opportunity to learn. We instil a belief and determination in our pupils that anyone can improve at anything with deliberate practice and effective feedback. We encourage pupils to be inspired rather than

threatened by the success of others. We encourage children to embrace the struggle, be flexible when success is not met and develop their psychosocial skills through our learner for life 'Hiltingbury Heroes'.

Children are awarded for demonstrating our learner for life skills and can become 'Hiltingbury Heroes' by completing their learner for life passport during their time with us. There are many opportunities for parents to participate in celebrations of learning throughout the year.



Keeping in Touch


We pride ourselves on our excellent communication with parents/carers, both on a formal and informal basis and value the partnership between home and school. At Hiltingbury we promote an open door policy, and class teachers are available every day to discuss any questions or concerns you may have. Our friendly admin staff keep parents well informed with emails and are available on the phone or face to face to help when needed. A weekly newsletter is also

sent home by the Headteacher to provide useful information, share learning highlights and celebrate achievements.

Parents are invited to pupil progress meetings with the class teacher throughout the year to discuss their child's progress and achievements. A written report is sent home at the end of the Summer Term. Meetings, videos and curriculum workshops are often held to further develop this support and understanding. Tapestry and Seesaw platforms are also utilised to ensure you are able to share experiences of your child's development.

Hiltingbury Hub

We are extremely fortunate to have a vast range of experiences and skillsets within our team. The 'Hiltingbury Hub' holds regular events; workshops, courses and activities to support with parenting, SEND and other themes, ran by our SENCO, Speech and Language Manager, Headteacher and other staff. Our hub is a unique facility which is open to the Hiltingbury community.





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Hiltingbury Schools Parent Teacher Association - 'HSPTA'

Our parent teacher association covers both schools and builds on our existing excellent links. The committee organise a whole range of events for both parents and children. The wealth of expertise and resourcefulness in the parent body, combined with their willingness to give time and effort, ensures a comprehensive and fun-filled series of events throughout the academic year. Our school gains tremendous benefit from the extra monies raised.

Governors

We have a dynamic, highly engaged and skilled Governing Body which works constructively and in partnership with the school. The Governors embrace the strategic role they have and are committed to helping the school provide the best possible education for its pupils.

The governing body meet regularly throughout the year to provide support and challenge to the school. The governors are often in school supporting developments and working in a range of capacities for example meeting with our school council and monitoring teaching and learning.

Speech and Language Resource Provision

We are very privileged to host our own resourced provision for children with Education, Health Care Plans for speech, language and communication needs. All placements are decided through the Special Educational Needs department within Hampshire County Council. We are extremely lucky to have an additional team of staff, with specialist expertise and knowledge who, alongside the class teachers and mainstream staff, aim to enable these children to access a mainstream curriculum in a supportive environment. These children access a mainstream education, spending most of their time in mainstream classes with friends and peers but will also spend some time in the resourced provision unit to access the additional specialist help and support available there.

Our school is proud to host this provision at Hiltingbury and strives to show impact across the school in quality first teaching suitable for children with speech, language and communication needs. This includes training in strategies such as Makaton, Cued articulation, Narrative therapy, Colour coded grammar and specific teaching of vocabulary.




Wrap Around Care


Admissions
