


Year 1 Curriculum

- The teachers are planning according to the needs of the children.
- We will be plugging gaps from the Year R/EYFS curriculum as well as teaching new content from the Year 1 programme of study.
- Phonics and reading will be a particular focus.

Morning Routine

Your children will come independently each morning and follow the routines which includes washing their hands, putting their book bag, lunch box and water bottle away, changing their reading books and settling to their morning activity.



Reading

As in Year R, children will continue to take part in a guided reading sessions and cosy reads. Please try to read with your child as frequently as possible at home. This should be recorded within their reading record book to communicate their progress, engagement and barriers to their teacher.

Banded Books

Your child will choose and regularly change a colour banded book which is suitably matched to their reading ability. The teacher will tell your child their level and will monitor and assess their progress regularly. There are no specific days your child can change their book, so please remind them to change it once they have finished.

Book Area

Your child can also choose a book to read for pleasure from our classroom.

Guided Reading

Your child will take part in a guided reading session at least once a week. The learning focus for the session will be shared with you in your child's reading record book.



Reading

Library

Children will also visit our school library weekly and bring home a book. These books are from Hampshire Library Service and we get charged if they are lost, so please ensure they are kept safe and returned to school once your child has finished with it. Children will be able to loan another book once they have made a return to our library.

Seesaw

- We will be using Seesaw to share children's learning journeys which is a Key Stage 1 alternative for Tapestry.
- If we do have to go into another lockdown, tasks and activities will be posted here daily for your child. Please do not post or complete activities from home unless we are in a lockdown, or you have been asked to do so for home learning tasks.
- We will upload the weekly phonics focus, spellings and other home learning onto Seesaw.
- If you have any problems downloading or using the app, please ask for some help.






Phonics

- Phonics is taught systematically on a daily basis and reinforced with weekly home learning.
- Teachers plan according to their classes and individual children's needs.
- Information about the phonemes and key words your child will be focusing on will be shown on their home learning sheet. You can also find useful documents within the Year 1 section of the website.
- Statutory National Phonics Screening Check will take place in the Summer Term usually during the first week in June. Please ensure your children are in school during this week unless they are unwell.

Home Learning

Maths: will be provided fortnightly on Seesaw.

<u>Phonics and Spelling:</u> will be uploaded onto Seesaw weekly. This will provide details of what your child will be covering in their daily phonics sessions for that week and suggest words to focus on at home. The spellings are linked to the spelling rules and common exception words that the children must learn to meet the expectations at the end of Year 1. They are tested on these words the following Friday.

Reading: Please read with your child daily at home. We recommend at least 5 to 10 minutes in our home learning policy.

Topic: There are two home projects during our Explorers and Minibeasts topics. Further suggestions for home learning linked to our topics will be provided for all areas of the curriculum in the curriculum overview you will receive at the start of every half term.



Spelling

- Spelling is a key priority in the curriculum.
- In order to support children in their spelling we will be having spelling quizzes regularly for most children.
- Children will keep the same spellings for two weeks.
- The quiz will held each Friday.
