## **Learning Highlights from Each Year Group**

#### Year R

This week in Reception we have been learning about our families and what is the same and different between our families. The children have all had the opportunity to share with their friends about their family and who is in their family. Thank you for all the photos that have been sent in, we will be making a class display of these so if you haven't already, please send a family photo into school. In maths, the children have been learning about sorting and how we can sort different objects into different sets according to their attributes (e.g size and colour). In RE, we have explored the concept of 'belonging' through our class, families and other groups that we might 'belong' to. The children sang our harvest song 'Big Red Combine Harvester' so well in our harvest assembly that we went to this morning. In phonics this week we have learnt the sounds ck, e, u, r and the tricky word 'l'.

### Year 1

The Year 1 children have been very busy this week. They have been designers in their D.T sessions as well as great geographers.

In the week, the children explored then evaluated different fruit salads from Waitrose, Coop, Sainsbury's and Tesco's. They then created a class design criteria and in small groups created a new fruit salad. Keith came to talk to the children about what they had made and whether it was colourful, full of different textures and whether it was nutritious and healthy.

On Thursday, the children visited Hiltingbury on a short field study for Geography. Whilst on the walk they learnt to identify human and physical features and to mark their route onto a map. The teachers were incredibly proud of the children's behaviour on the walk. Well done Year 1!

# Year 2

Year 2 started their week with a walk of the local area. During the walk, they identified human and physical features. We were extremely proud of the children; their knowledge was fantastic! The walk supported children's learning in geography and the children later developed their own map with a key. In literacy, children applied their learning of sentences with different forms to write a recount of their walk to Hocombe Mead. We were really impressed with how well they had remembered their learning to punctuate their sentences accurately with a capital letter and appropriate end mark (full stop, question mark, exclamation mark). In maths, the children have been learning about estimation and have used this to estimate missing numbers on a number line. On Friday, the children enjoyed a Harvest festival. We would like to thank Mrs Ford and Mrs Williams for teaching them the songs; the children sang beautifully. Thank you so much for all your generous Harvest donations.
