Learning Highlights from Each Year Group

Year R

It was lovely to welcome the children back on Tuesday, it's been a busy but short week! This week, the children have engaged really well in the discussions we have had about technology and the different technology that the children have in their homes. In maths, the children have been learning about repeating patterns. They have learnt that an AB repeating pattern is one where 2 different things repeat. They have all explored making repeating patterns in a variety of ways in the classroom. We began our learning about patterns on a welly walk on Tuesday where we collected a selection of natural autumnal resources from the playground. In phonics this week, the children have learnt the sounds ff, ss, ll and j. They have learnt the tricky words put, pull, full, as.

Year 1

Well done to all the Year 1 children for uploading their home learning online on Thursday when we were shut due to the storm. It was lovely to see so many children engaging with the learning tasks. Thank you to all the parents for their support with this.

This week the children have started to learn more about seasonal changes within our science sessions. They learnt the words 'evergreen' and 'deciduous' to describe different trees. We went on a walk around the school to spot these different trees and observe any changes. The children were thrilled to find many acorns, conkers and leaves. We are also going to be learning about materials and what a material is. Please encourage your child to know the names such as fabric, plastic, glass, metal, wood, leather etc so that they can begin to name these with confidence. The Year 1 children impressed us with their Maths knowledge this week as we started our Maths journey on addition. The children confidently used the part whole model diagram to identify the parts as well as the whole number. They used practical resources to show the parts and whole. We will be moving onto learning fact families of numbers to 10.

As we explained the children have been set some tricky word spellings on Seesaw. The children will have a spelling quiz the following Friday on these words. Please support us with these and if you have trouble accessing Seesaw please talk to your class teacher. Thank you.

Year 2

What a fantastic first week back Year 2 have had! On Tuesday, the children went back in time as they visited Tudor House to launch their 'Medieval Life' topic. The children had time to explore the museum, walk the medieval walls; visiting two different vaults underground, and explored artefacts during a workshop led by the museum staff. They were super historians as they examined the artefacts and identified the jobs of people from the past. We were really impressed with their behaviour and engagement. Thank you to all the parents and grandparents that gave up their time to help; we couldn't do it without your support. On Wednesday, the children enjoyed coming to school dressed up, we were impressed with the range of creative outfits we saw. They revisited their writing learning journey from last half term to apply their learning of accurately punctuated sentences to write a recount of the trip. Year 2 would like to say a massive thank you to Mrs Nieto, Tiago and his grandmother for coming in to school to deliver an assembly on the Mexican 'Day of the Dead' holiday. The children all gained so much knowledge about this celebration and enjoyed the range of creative opportunities they had planned. We are really grateful to them for arranging and preparing the resources for the children. Finally, we would like to say thank you for all your support with home learning due to the disruption caused by Storm Ciaran this week.
