# **Learning Highlights from Each Year Group**

## Year R

Nativity season is well underway in Reception this week! We have started to learn the songs for our 'Noisy Nativity' production and begun to think about how these songs tell us the story of Christmas. In Drawing Club this week, the children have learnt the story 'Mixed' and have explored new vocabulary linked to the story. We have seen some great drawings and 'passcodes' from all of the children this week, their 'give it a go' attitude to drawing has been wonderful to see. In maths, the children have been applying their knowledge of numbers 1,2,3 to learn about the composition of numbers 4 and 5. In PE, the children have continued to learn about travelling in different ways, directions and speed. The children have continued to amaze us with their fantastic progress in phonics and reading.

#### Year 1

This week the Year One children have worked hard and learnt to ask and answer questions in history and to understand the term 'living memory'. The children learnt what a timeline is and why it is important. It has helped them sequence the times and dates in chronological order. Year 1 ordered pictures of themselves with toys now, as a baby and of their parent with a toy. We had some great discussions and those showing their own life. Perhaps the children can find other timelines in books to show chronology. Thank you so much for sending in the photos for your child to order.

During our English sessions, the children have learnt what verbs are and have identified these within pictures and sentences. Perhaps help your child to find more verbs when they are reading with you.

In maths the children have learnt about the operation of subtraction. They have learnt to take the smaller number away from the large amount. This was done practically with objects and then the children crossed amounts in subtraction stories to match subtraction number sentences e.g. 5-3=2

### Year 2

Year 2 have had a busy week beginning to think about their winter production of 'Eddie the Penguin Saves the World'. The children have enjoyed starting to learn the songs, script and staging throughout the week. You should have all received a costume letter which was sent home on Wednesday. Thank you for supporting us by providing costumes for your child; these should be brought to school in a named carrier bag by Monday 4<sup>th</sup> December at the latest.

In maths, the children have continued to practise fluently recalling their number bonds to 10 and using these to support their knowledge of known facts within 100. They have started to practise using efficient strategies such as number bonds, near doubles and doubles to solve addition problems. In literacy, the children have learnt to use coordinating conjunctions to join clauses and include compound sentences within their writing. We have been really impressed with their engagement. In DT the children have continued to think about wheels and axels and explored current products to support them in designing their own product that meets the needs of a design brief. On Friday, it was wonderful to award our first reading raffle winners with a book to keep. Please continue to encourage your child to read as much as possible at home and record this in their reading diary to ensure they are entered in our next raffle!
