Learning Highlights from Each Year Group

Year R

It's been lovely to welcome the children back to school after the Christmas break, hearing about all the presents that have been received and all the wonderful things the children have been up to. All the children have been excited to see their friends again and have settled back into school routines really well. This week in phonics, the children have learnt the new phonemes ai, ee, igh and oa and have been using these to read new words. In maths this week, the children have been learning about shapes that have got 4 sides, the names of these shapes, sorting them and finding them around the classroom and outside.

Year 1

The Year 1 children have really enjoyed learning to act out the traditional story, The Gingerbread Man. The children tried hard to join in with the repetitive phrases and began to use language found in stories.

During our English sessions the children have learnt what an adjective is and how it describes a noun. They are learning to describe different characters from stories using adjectives.

During the children's gymnastic sessions, they learnt what 'balance' means and learnt to balance on different parts of their body. The children worked well with others and it was lovely to see them working together like 'Ellie Elephant'.

The children have been learning that digits can also be written in words e.g nineteen 19. Please practise these with your child at home. We wish you all a Happy New Year!

Year 2

Happy New Year! We are so impressed with how settled the children have returned to school and have enjoyed hearing their holiday news. This week, the children have started the new Little Wandle Spelling programme, which is designed for Year 2 children. They have started to use their phonetic knowledge to support their spelling and this will be our focus for the rest of the year. The programme begins with much focus on unusual spelling patterns such as why words have alternative graphemes used to make unusual sounds. They will also learn about 'tricky spellings' (common exception words) and we have sent home a list of the words for Year 2 this week. Please support your child to learn how to spell these words and apply them within sentences in their longer pieces of writing. Thank you for your continued support. The children have also consolidated prior learning this week in both maths and literacy to apply what they have been taught in different ways. We have had some fantastic writing using coordinating and subordinating conjunctions and the children have also showed us how much they have retained from their addition learning journey.
