Learning Highlights from Each Year Group

Year R

It has been lovely to welcome the children back this week after their half term break. In phonics, we have been recapping some of the sounds that the children have previously learnt and applying this knowledge when reading words. The children have been applying their phonic knowledge into their writing this week. We have been focussing on sentences and sentence structure – saying the sentences out loud, counting the words and writing each word to create a simple sentence. In maths, the children have been learning about 'pairs,' what a pair is and how this links to odd and even numbers. In PE this week, the children have been learning about

emotions linked to music and how we can move our bodies accordingly. Our focus text in Drawing Club this week has been 'Tiddler,' the new words the children have learnt are 'traipsing, ensnare, tardy, reunited, conversing.'

Year 1

This week the children enjoyed their first 'All stars' cricket coaching with Ben. He gave an engaging assembly about what cricket is, the cricket skills he is going to be teaching the children over the next half term and how working as a team is very important in this sport. The children then enjoyed the active session learning about working as a team to score points through short games in pairs and larger groups. It was wonderful to see how the children responded, listened well and then followed the instructions. We look forward to his sessions each Thursday and next week he will be focusing on improving catching skills. In English the children have continued to practise re-reading their sentences, checking that no small words are left out and to edit their work. We have worked in small guided groups to help them know what their targets are and how they can improve their writing. In Design and Technology, the children have been learning about 'mechanisms' and finding 'levers' and 'sliding' mechanisms in everyday objects such as scissors, seesaws, tongs, door handles and sliders within moveable flap books. The children evaluated these objects and moveable books and expressed what they liked and or disliked about them. Please look for levers and sliders in the books and objects you might have at home. If you want to bring some of these in, we would love to share them with the class. In R.E we have started the big idea 'Welcoming' and the children enjoyed acting out a few role play situations when they could welcome a person to a new group.







Year 2

What an exciting week Year 2 have had! They have returned showing such enthusiasm and excitement for our new topic 'London's Burning'. It was wonderful to see the children in their costumes as we travelled back to 1666 on Thursday. It was wonderful to observe the children using their knowledge of how historians find out about the past to ask questions and learn about life in the past. The children enjoyed playing various roles within the production and we were blown away with their engagement. Already, the children know so much about this significant event from the past and this will greatly support their application of learning. In maths, the children have been learning to solve multiplication problems by using repeated addition. In writing, the children have been learning about contractions and how these are used in informal speech and writing.
